1. Welcome/Introductions-Cami Munk,-SCC Chair- **Ms. Munk welcomed everyone that attended the SCC meeting for January 19th**
2. Approval of Minutes from December 15, 2016 meeting-Cami Munk- **Ms. Munk made a motion to approve the minutes then followed by Ms. Francis and it was approved by all attendance for approval of minutes.**
3. Monetary Gift from Nestle Foods in the amount of \$5,000.00 to support Health and Physical Fitness-funds will be used to purchase p.e. equipment, recess equipment and support emergency kits. The Emergency Preparedness Committee and parents who are interested will meet to make a final recommendation on what should supplies will go into the kits. This meeting will take place in the next few weeks. Are there interested parents who would like to be involved in this Project? **A parent made the suggestion for Bennion students to make thank you cards or a video for Nestle for the generous donation.**
4. S.A.F.E. Neighborhoods: Lalt Lake City School District "JIT' Kits-S.A.F.E. Neighborhoods trains individuals in each elementary school neighborhood to open, staff, and operate their own neighborhood reunification/evacuation hub a school until outside help arrives after a catastrophic disaster. S.A.F.E. Utah teaches individuals to create a 96-hour kit, grab your kit walk to school" in the event of a catastrophic disaster. It also assists and relies upon "neighbors helping neighbors" to assess critical and immediate emergency needs, keep residents informed, and reunify families. S.A.F.E. Neighborhoods id dependent on the whole community approach involving: Government; Red Cross, CERT; MRC, church groups, Volunteers, community groups, community leaders, businesses and schools. A meeting will be held at each elementary school and our goal is to get the word out to the entire school community and neighborhood to come and participate in the training. Bennion will host a training that will take about 1.5 hours.. For more information: www.SAFEUTAH.ORG- **it's a program where it unites the neighborhood and**

school which provides training to everyone for catastrophe emergency events. Many parents were willing to provide their support by helping with putting our emergency kits together and other input ideas for our emergency kits. A parent suggested that the school assures that our emergency registration cards that we have for students are up to date and that we know which students have medical alerts.

5. Turnaround School Update-

6. Computer purchases schoolwide to enhance student use of technology and to support on-line testing. **96 laptops were purchased for our school and the School board has been in support. Laptops are to support ST Math, Lexia testing and all other testing.**

7. NAEP Testing coming up for 4th grade students-March 6th. NAEP is the largest nationally representative and continuing assessment of what students in the United States know and can do in various subjects. It is administered by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), within the U.S. Department of Education. As part of the NAEP 2017 program, students will participate in mathematics and reading assessments. National and state-level results will be released as The Nation's Report Card.

Most students will take the assessment on tablets with keyboards provided by NAEP representatives. A subset of students will take paper-and-pencil versions of the assessment. NAEP is administering the assessments via both tablets and paper booklets to evaluate any differences in student performance. Each student will be assessed in only one subject. **Bennion's 4th grade students have been selected to do NAEP testing, that data will be used for research for development for curriculum.**

8. Math Facts-Parents help your students learn their facts at home. Students will be rewarded for 100% mastery of facts learned. **There is a gumball bulletin located in the lunch room hall and it will be used as a visual and motivator for students to master their math skills in class.**

9. SEP Conferences coming up on January 24th 25th and 26th. God Father's Pizza Party for classes that achieve 100% attendance. Pizza party is sponsored by Capital Church. **Teachers have sent out notifications about reaching the 100% parent SEP conference attendance. Capitol Church does a generous pizza party for our students if 100% parent SEP conference attendance is met.**

10. Stakeholder Survey's-How do we want to proceed with parents filling the survey out on-line so we can get as many parents participating as possible? **Teachers will be notifying parents during SEP Conference. Other notifications will be through DOJO, poster, flyers and computers will be available to parents.**

11. Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Training-**House Bill (H.B.) 286**, scheduled to be fully implemented in schools in 2016, **requires** district/schools to use the instructional materials approved by the Utah State Board of Education (USBE) to provide child sexual abuse prevention and awareness training and instruction of school personnel, and the parents/guardians of

elementary school students. We will be having Prevent Child Abuse Utah scheduled to do class presentations and a notice will be sent home to parents informing them of the presentation. Parents will have the option of opting their student out of the presentation if they choose. Bennion faculty will be informed of the online website to do the training on line. Once completed, staff can print a certificate of completion. Parents will be given the opportunity to do the training on line as well. What do you think would be the best way of getting the information out to parents to complete the training so we have as many parents as possible taking advantage of it?
